

As a participant in WCN's Career Program, she aims to establish a seed bank specifically to promote indigenous tree species restoration in Rwanda, map mature indigenous trees that can be used for ongoing seed harvest, engage women at sites around the country, training them as 'Seed Champions' and paying them for the collection of indigenous tree seeds to supply RWCA's nursery and support their livelihoods. She would also like to acquire the necessary skills for managing and running conservation projects smoothly and scientific writing.

As a Career Program participant, Dominique's goals are to build a strong autonomous voice in conservation in Mozambique and Africa, develop high impact research that influences conservation management and policy in protected areas through scientific work and trust to lift communities out of poverty, revive communities' stewardship and ownership of biodiversity, encourage long term support in conservation, address conservation and human wildlife conflict, and ensure conservation of endangered species such as the African Elephant.


